Doesn't really bear thinking about... so... let's think about positive things like seeds and seeding!!!! We're coming up on the best possible times to start all kinds of seeds. And seeds provide so much hope! Everyone needs a little hope the snow will go and the gardens will GROW!

There are potting mixes for almost all needs — and we're really pleased that there's such a wide range to choose from (to match all those different gardening needs). Make sure you check out Coast of Maine's Stonington blend - Click Here developed for the marijuana trade, but so incredibly excellent for any high performing plant in a container — whether tomatoes, cucumbers, zinnias or dahlias — it's an excellent blend. You'll also find Fox Farm's Happy Frog and Ocean Forest potting soils, Black Gold's all purpose and seedling mix and — my personal favorite — Promix — a truly professional mix with mycorrhizal inoculants built in. Happy to answer any questions about any of the mixes — and walk you through how to get your seeds off to their best start. In fact, we've posted a worksheet to the website that outlines the basics of getting seeds started off right. We've also started a few trays of seeds in different mixes (onions for now, but will add more) at the back of the store so that you can check out how each mix works and see how the seedlings perform. You'll find them on the back shelves near the library and the classroom tables...

And now for a dose of real cuteness!! Have to think cute while the storm rages...Got Bunnies? Want to Get Bunnies? Spring (and Easter) seems to bring out the interest in rabbits and other house pets. House rabbits/Guinea pigs, chinchillas, degus and hedge hogs are a totally fascinating addition to any household that likes an easy but entertaining pal to I paround with.

Did you know that your rabbit has a brain?? And, actually, wants to use it?? (don't you wish that was true for all warm-blooded brains!!!) It's easy to think they're just a cute living ornament, but really – they're an inquisitive and active member of your family. Since we've started working with the store's small animal owners, we've been charmed by story after story about rabbits, Guinea pigs (that have no "pig" in them!), chinchillas, degus and hedge hogs.

There are specific feeds for all of them of course (and we're even carrying the juvenile and senior versions), but what's really fascinating is the toys – all of the marvelous enrichment toys that these charming animals want to play with. Every-one seems to totally understand treats and toys for dogs and cats, but rabbits and Guinea pigs??? Yes!! And – they have preferences!! There are balls to bounce (with their back feet), danglies to pull down with their front feet (all are safe to eat!!) and all kinds of digging/chewing toys and treats for those other boring mo-ments. Rabbits can be housetrained as well and can spend most evenings hanging out with the family. And let's not forget the treats... Did you know there are all kinds of hays for these pets – including an herbal hay mix? Wish our goats had access to this kind of quality for their hay! There are even "cookies" for those
